# Note from our Executive Director

Dear Friend of MSA,

Thank you so much for bringing your energy and excitement to our vibrant community arts center this past year. We invite you to take a moment to celebrate with us and reflect on everything that we accomplished together as a community.

In many ways, 2022 was a year of firsts for Mayo Street Arts:

- With support from the Maine Arts Commission, our Traditional Arts Network began a **TAN Fund** micro granting program, which put \$8,000 in funds directly into the hands of traditional artists through a low-barrier application process.
- We partnered with East Shore Arts to launch the inaugural **Portland Theater Festival**, which presented challenging productions centering BIPOC and queer/trans artists and garnered national acclaim with coverage in American Theatre.
- Immediately on the heels of PTF, we introduced **Puppets in Portland**, a biannual city-wide festival of international puppetry, featuring artists from Czech Republic, Jordan, Germany, Kenya, and across the US.

Despite being the first of their kind, each of these new programs is – at its core – tied directly to our mission to foster a robust creative community. Our existing programs continue to flourish as we re-engage our Kennedy Park neighborhood families and students with year-round opportunities, rebuilding relationships that were waylaid by the break in programming precipitated by the pandemic.

MSA's performances, workshops, and visual arts exhibits featured artists from across North America, South America, and Europe, as well as plenty of amazing work from local emerging artists right here in our community. Audiences have returned to pre-pandemic levels, hungry for the opportunity to gather and enjoy transformative experiences with each other.

I cannot wait to see what 2023 has in store. Thanks to all of you fabulous supporters, our amazing staff, and the dedicated members of our Board of Directors and program steering committees, I have no doubt that it will be another year full of joy, community, and plenty of mind-bending art.

# Our Mission & What We Do

***Mayo Street Arts strives strengthen its neighborhood and community by providing a haven for the arts that is vibrant, safe, and inspiring; and to engage area youths of diverse cultural communities in robust participation in the visual, performing, and literary arts.***

MSA is a welcoming community arts center in the heart of East Bayside's Kennedy Park: the most densely populated, ethnically and culturally diverse square mile in Maine. Our building serves as a performance venue, gallery, and gathering space, and offers affordable studios and rehearsal space for artists. Our programming embraces variety, with a particular focus on puppetry and folk music and dance.

MSA is committed to making our programs accessible to all – removing financial barriers through pay-what-you-can tickets for all events, and mobility barriers with the addition of a wheelchair lift. MSA deeply engages the people we serve in all phases of our programming, including the incorporation of artist and student-led steering committees.

In addition to visual and performing arts programs, we are dedicated to community enrichment. MSA offers audiences opportunities to participate in the forms they see on our stage through workshops with visiting artists, puppet slams, and open mics. MSA is also proud to conduct free year-round youth & family programming. This includes all-ages performances, a slate of after-school programs, a literacy-rich summer camp, multigenerational classes, and our East End Community School Partnership, which brings performances and workshops with visiting artists directly into our local elementary school.

In collaboration with Cultural Resources, MSA operates the Traditional Arts Network (TAN). Funded in part by the National Endowment for the Arts, TAN is a consortium of traditional artists and ensembles who wish to preserve and share their artistic and cultural practices. TAN pools resources to offer support financially in the form of microgrants, as well as opportunities for marketing, grant-writing, networking, and more.

In 2022, MSA launched Puppets in Portland (PiP) a biannual city-wide festival of international puppetry arts – a natural evolution of MSA's commitment to supporting and sharing puppetry in all of its wondrous forms.

# 2022 Visual & Performing Art Events



Local rappers shook MSA's walls with suave beats and melodic flows at **New Starz on Mayo St.** Curated by Portland's own Shine and emceed by special guest Neeko Brown, this showcase featuring AB the King, KSL (pictured), Superstar Freddy, Don Julio, and others had audience members taking full advantage of our open floor to jump and dance to the rhythms.

*January 2022*

Wabanaki music keeper and member of the Penobscot Nation **Firefly the Hybrid** brought the cosmos alive inside MSA when he completely transformed our venue – floors to ceilings – for two nights. Through his unique fusion of cutting-edge projections and traditional ancestral music, Firefly swirled audience members through his creative visions and healing frequencies.

*April 2022*



In partnership with East Shore Arts, we launched the inaugural **Portland Theater Festival** bringing a summer season of diverse, inclusive, and exceptional professional theater to the City of Portland. The trio of plays concluded with **Pony by Sylvan Oswald**, a seminal work of trans theater exploring questions of generational difference, class, and gender.

Featuring 5 artist groups representing 6 countries, MSA launched **Puppets in Portland**, a city-wide festival of international puppetry arts. Performances began with **War Maker by Czech Republic-based Dafa Puppet Theatre**, an object theater show adapted by Palestinian-Jordanian puppeteer Husam Abed, based on the true story of Palestinian visual artist and refugee Karim Shaheen.

Having just completed a school residency the day prior as a part of our East End Community School Partnership, the **Fabiola Mendez Trio** performed **Afrorriqueña** for a jam-packed house. Following the musical tribute to the Jíbaro and African roots in Puerto Rican culture featuring Fabiola's world-class cuatro playing, audience members bombarded the band for selfies in front of the Puerto Rican flag.

# 2022 Community & Youth Events

The main hall of MSA's building finally became physically accessible for everyone for the first time in its 132 year history with the completion of our lift! 2022 Board Chair Troy Moon officiated the celebration, dubbed **MSA Lifts Up Portland!**, with a ribbon cutting, flanked by music from the Ideal Maine Social Aid & Sanctuary Band and a crowd of cheering community members.

Summers at MSA got a lot more **RAD!** with the return of our free summer camp for neighborhood youths! 35+ campers enjoyed 6 weeks of arts-based learning featuring visiting teaching and performing artists, field trips to local attractions, and weekly visits from the **Portland Public Library's Bookmobile**.  
*July 2022*

The **Traditional Arts Network (TAN) Fund** awarded its first round of artist microgrants. These grants are designed to provide artists with a low-barrier, first time experience with grant applications, and provide cash awards of \$500-1,000. Grants were awarded to 8 artists including International Open Mic regular **Baba Ly**, a Fulani acoustic guitar player and storyteller, whose award will assist him in purchasing a professional sound system.

MSA's recurring **Puppeteers' Happy Hour** refocused on skill development and hands-on learning and workshop opportunities, like a **Trash Puppets workshop** led by Inventing Trees. Attendees quite literally turned trash into treasure and crafted a myriad of creatures from an unlikely assortment of scraps.

Surrounded by joyful community members, MSA awarded **Jenny Van West** and **Bondeko** the **2022 MSA Mission Fund Awards**, which honor artists of exceptional talent who fulfill the Mayo Street Arts mission.
